Council Mark says: It's been a moving experience

Yes indeed, after nearly 36 years on the same property (although not in the same house) Mark and Cindy have left Petley Rd and moved to Whakapirau. I had always thought that it was David Lange who had said the past is a foreign country, but when I looked it up, the full quote is: "The past is a foreign country: they do things differently there". This is a line out of L. P. Hartley's book, The Go Between. I recall seeing the movie made from the book many years ago, must have been in a foreign country.

Why I mention this is that I feel some of my past is left behind at our old address, in the form of trees planted, fences erected, and houses built; now it is the turn of some new people to mould their own history on the place. They will do things differently there. The other part of the equation is how we will graft our past onto our new property, one of the challenges being that we have moved into a smaller house, and with it the realisation that we have a lot more stuff than we need here. I think we have done our kids a huge favour by moving into a smaller place – they won't have so much to sort through when we're gone. And just because Petley Rd is now a foreign country to us, it does not mean we forget it – it still lives on in our memories at the same time as Whakapirau adds more experiences.
